CONFIRMATION

UPDATE

Since some time in the early 2000s, Confirmands at Bethlehem have shared their Statements of Faith in worship prior to their Confirmation. Crafting the statement offers them an opportunity to really think through what they believe based on what they are learning in class.

However, what is meant to be an affirming and life-giving exercise has often also been a source of extreme anxiety. (As we believe it would be for our adult new members if they were required to complete the same assignment!) This has led the Spiritual Council to consider if the sharing of the Statements of Faith is sometimes causing more harm than good.

No matter how many times kids are assured it's okay not to have everything figured out, it is hard for 13- and 14-year-olds not to feel a tremendous burden of "getting it right" or "believing the right things." And, in fact, that goes against what many adults in this congregation believe about the life of faith: that it's a journey and that it's less about certainty and more about committing to continue the journey in spite of our lack of understanding.

What is more, the Confirmands already do make a public statement about their faith during the Confirmation service by affirming their baptismal vows. On Confirmation Sunday they will be asked to respond to these questions:

- Do you desire to affirm your baptism into the faith and family of Jesus Christ?
- Do you renounce the powers of evil and desire the freedom of new

life in Christ?

- Do you profess Jesus Christ as Lord and savior?
- Do you promise, by the grace of God, to be Christ disciple, to follow in the way of our savior, to resist oppression and evil, to show love and justice, and to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able?
- Do you promise, according to the grace given you, to grow in the Christian faith and to be a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ, celebrating Christ's presence and furthering Christ mission in all the world?

We are all interested to hear where the kids are on their own spiritual journeys. However, a statement shared under duress is not the same as a joyous sharing of testimony. Therefore, the Spiritual Council has decided that sharing of the Confirmands' Statements of Faith in worship will be optional. Note: All Confirmands will still complete their statements and share them with their individual mentor as well as the Senior Pastor.

If you have any questions or concerns about this decision, you are welcome to speak with any one of the current elders or pastors. We look forward to continuing to support our Confirmands as we get closer to the big day on April 21! We are so blessed to have these young people as part of our church family!



Road Construction on Oak Hill Rd.



Beginning March 27 through August 1, 2025, please use an alternate route when traveling from the north on Oak Hill. Our parking lot entrances will not be affected. A map and full details are below.



"Beginning on or after March 27, 2024, Oak Hill Road will be closed to all through traffic between Heckel Road and Millersburg Road. This closure is required for the reconstruction of Oak Hill Road. The detour around this road closure will be Heckel Road, Green River Road, and Millersburg Road. The first phase of the reconstruction will be done between Eastwood Drive and Voigt Road. For the duration of the construction, the road will only provide access to local traffic. During the first phase of construction, all residents south of Voigt Road will have to access their properties from the south end of the project near Heckel Road. All residents north of Voigt Road will have to access their properties from the north end of the project at Millersburg Road. All Oak Hill School traffic will be required to enter and exit the school to the north towards Millersburg Road.

Once the first section of the reconstruction is completed, the portion of Oak Hill Road between Voigt Road and Millersburg Road will be reconstructed during phase two of the project. An updated notice will be sent out when the change in traffic patterns takes place when phase two begins.

The project is expected to be completed by August 1, 2025."
