On January 7, 2025, wildfire activity began in Los Angeles County, California. Although all the fires are thankfully out, the devastation remains. Thousands of buildings have been destroyed, and many, many people displaced from their homes. The destruction is historic.

Altadena Community Church UCC has been lost. Their building provided a home for a Montessori preschool, choral and theatre community groups, a food pantry, and more. Two other faith communities in the immediate neighborhood were also destroyed.
