For some in our church family, this has been a very hard week. We have many students and alumni connected to the North High School district. When a teacher abuses his position in any fashion, it breaches trust. When the abuse is of the magnitude of the accusations in this instance, it is devastating to our entire community. We are wise to turn to God in prayer.

Here are some ideas that might guide your prayers for this situation:

- Pray for the victim, giving thanks for her courage and strength, and asking for her comfort and healing. Pray also for those who love her and are her support system.
- Pray for any others who have similar stories and for whom this story recalls their own pain.
- Pray for students who knew and loved this teacher. Ask God to hold them in their disillusionment, hurt, anger, and this loss of innocence.
- Pray for teachers everywhere who work so hard to cultivate healthy
 relationships with their students, who show up every day demonstrating they
 are worthy of the trust we place in them. Comfort them in their grief and
 anger.
- Pray for the officials who are handling the fallout. May they investigate and lead with integrity and sensitivity.
- Pray for the accused. Pray for truth, accountability, and repentance. Ask the

Holy Spirit to intervene to give voice to the prayers we cannot articulate, but know we should be praying, as our Lord instructed us to (Matthew 5.44-45; Romans 8.26-27).




The Committee has a variety of indoor and outdoor tasks and looks forward to welcoming everyone with bagels, donuts, and coffee as early as 7:00 am.
