


This Saturday


The Committee has a variety of indoor and outdoor tasks and looks forward to welcoming everyone with bagels, donuts, and coffee at 7:30 am.

Whether you were with us in person or are catching up now, we want to share this brief summary of the evening's highlights and the exciting direction we're pursuing together.

We're grateful for your continued support, your thoughtful presence, and the spirit of partnership that makes this work possible.

Rev. Michael Erwin Executive Director Good Samaritan Annual Meeting Summary

May 6, 2025 – "Now It Springs Forth"

Last week, the Good Samaritan community gathered for its 63rd Annual Meeting at Bethel United Church of Christ in Evansville, under the theme:

"Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:19)

This scripture set the tone for an evening focused on hope, renewal, and forward movement. Sixty-five delegates from seventeen member churches and guests were welcomed by Board Chair Andy Mosier and Executive Director Rev. Michael Erwin. The Rev. Chad Abbott, Conference Minister for the Indiana-Kentucky Conference of

the United Church of Christ, offered a meaningful invocation and blessing, and we enjoyed another excellent dinner provided by Acropolis.

One of the most poignant moments of the evening was the recognition of the late Rev. Mary Hurley, who served as Chaplain of the Good Samaritan Home for over 25 years and more recently as a member of the Board. Her deep impact was honored with a moment of silence and a prayer of thanksgiving.

The meeting also included a special tribute to Kay Vaught, who completed her fourth consecutive board term after twelve years of dedicated service. Many current board members credit Kay with creating a legacy of leadership that continues to shape Good Sam's future. We look forward to Kay's continued involvement with the Board as a Strategic Board Advisor.

A New Direction: One Plan, Two Initiatives

The heart of the evening was the presentation of the Board's unified proposal for Good Samaritan's next chapter. This new plan is the result of over a year of discernment and research, initiated by the membership's 2024 call to explore needs related to poverty, mental health, and senior care.

Those three focus areas were brought together in one coordinated plan with two major initiatives:

- Affordable Housing A \$5 million, five-year grantmaking initiative to support the creation and preservation of safe, affordable, and energy-efficient housing in southwestern Indiana, along with wraparound services such as financial literacy and home repairs.
- Mental Health & Senior Care Access A \$1 million initiative to expand access to care by investing in social work education and training through the University of Southern Indiana. The plan includes paid student stipends, a new full-time faculty position, and support for establishing community-based outreach clinics with many hosted by member churches.

Together, these initiatives reflect Good Sam's legacy of "providing a caring community through an atmosphere of Christian love and concern."

Thoughtful Dialogue and Unanimous Affirmation

Delegates engaged in thoughtful and constructive dialogue during the Q&A, asking

important questions about implementation, partnerships, and long-term impact. After discussion, the membership offered unanimous affirmation and support for the plan and the Board's direction.

What Comes Next

Over the coming months, the Board and Staff will begin implementing the framework for both initiatives. This includes:

- Developing a grant application process for the housing initiative.
- Collaborating with USI's Social Work Department to formalize the education and outreach partnerships.
- Making updates to policies, legal filings, and procedures to support the new mission.

We are excited to move forward with purpose and clarity, and grateful to be doing so in partnership with you.
