The hope is to address current proposals for severe funding cuts. The administration's FY 2026 budget proposes cuts across the Department of Energy (DOE). Funding for the Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy (EERE) would be cut by 74%, and its budget for renewable energy technologies would drop from \$795 million to \$240 million.

At the end of worship, we will collect your cards in baskets as you exit the sanctuary. Member(s) of the Green Team will deliver these cards to Representative Messmer's local office.
