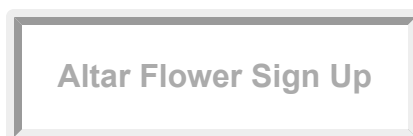
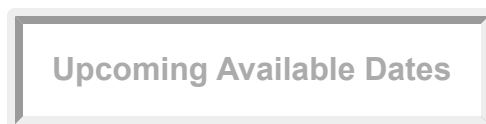


The flowers are given by the Altar Guild to the glory of God. The white rose is in memory of Carolyn Dacy.
