Pastor's Perspective



We had a great week "Building Faith" at Vacation Bible School. VBS is so easy to love: we work together for a common purpose, celebrate our faith, and share it with our children through food, songs, story, crafts, and play. It's truly one of the best weeks of the year.



But it's only that: once a year. And once a year—no matter how gifted our teachers and leaders—is not enough to establish and sustain a life of faith in our children.

Rather than *the main event*, we ought to view VBS as an investment in our children. It's a way of communicating to them that we see them, that we care about them, that we consider

ourselves blessed that they are part of our church family, and that we aren't complete without them. What is more, VBS demonstrates that we want to share with them a faith that is important to us.

If VBS were just about getting the lessons taught and the crafts done, then we had way more adults and youth helpers than we needed this week. But "getting the job done" is not the priority. More important is building relationships around our shared faith in Jesus. Thank you to all who interacted with a child this week—from the one refilling lemonade, to

the one squirting paint, to the one ooh-ing and aah-ing over Lego creations—it all matters.

Friends, the life of faith is a long, sustained, journey. And children who are just setting out need reference points along the way—youth to look up to, adults who truly care about knowing them, as well as the leadership of pastors and staff members. We made vows at their baptisms to guide them in this journey!





So, if you brought your children to VBS, please bring them back. VBS is a great opportunity for faith formation, but it can't hold a candle to sustained participation in worship and Sunday School. We love your kids, and we want to continue sharing the life of faith with them!

If you helped with VBS, extend your investment by seeking out the children when you see them at church. Call them by name. Ask them how their summer is going. Talk to them about ANYTHING. They notice and it matters. And it teaches them how to invest in the children who come after them.

I am thankful that week-in and week-out, young and old are "Building Faith" together here at Bethlehem United Church of Christ. Another VBS is behind us, but let's not put those bricks away just yet. We've got so much more to do.

Church has an AED?

While at the church, if you were asked to **get the AED** (Automated External Defibrillator) for a possible cardiac arrest, would you know where the AED is located? Please take a moment the next time you are by the elevator on the sanctuary level (level 4 next to the family bathroom) to notice the AED box hanging on the wall.



If you are asked to retrieve the AED in an emergency:

- 1. Run to the AED location.
- 2. Open the box door.
- 3. Bring the device along with any equipment inside the box to the rescuer.

We have periodically held classes at the church on adult CPR and use of the AED. If you are interested in attending a class to learn these lifesaving measures, contact Jean Hunt.



Parting Ways with the Patch

For more than 20 years, Bethlehem has hosted the Pumpkin Patch every October. When it began, and for many years, it was a fundraiser for youth mission trips. A few years ago, the Patch transitioned to being the funding stream for Bethlehem's annual Bucket Blitz.

In the beginning, a pumpkin patch was a fairly new and unique idea. Now pumpkins can be found in many store parking lots and start showing up in September. In addition, a decline in volunteers, and uncertain profit margins, have become significant concerns. For all these reasons, the Outreach Team has decided to discontinue this fundraiser. We will be looking for other ways to fund the Bucket Blitz, as we believe this is an important ministry.

Thanks and appreciation go to all who have given their time and talents to this project in so many ways: decorating, hanging lights, unloading, setting up and taking down, volunteering for shifts in the Patch, purchasing pumpkins, and more.
