




# Pastor's Perspective



It's hard to believe this time last year we were in the midst of the Sabbatical Summer here at Bethlehem. (The year has gone by so quickly!) Part of the purpose of my time away was to come back and share some of what I learned/experienced with the congregation.

To that end: The Sabbatical included a ten-day Civil Rights tour through the southern US. I learned so much about our history and about the role of the church (for good and for ill) in the Civil Rights Movement. I'm excited to share some of what I learned with others!



You are invited to be part of a Civil Rights Study and Trip that will begin at the start of the coming school year. We will read *The Color of Compromise* by Jemar Tisby and *How the Word is Passed* by Clint Smith.

The study portion will begin in the fall of 2025. In spring of 2026, we'll travel to Birmingham and Montgomery (and maybe a plantation in Louisiana--we'll let the group decide!).

So far, we have 19 people signed up (thirteen from Bethlehem and six from the ETSA). Once we have identified all who wish to participate, we'll make plans as a group about how often and in what format (in person, Zoom,


etc.) we'd like to meet as we work through these readings together.



### A note from Bosse Teacher Leigh Gray




Hi, my name is Leigh Gray, and I am the construction teacher at Bosse High School. At 52 years of age, I decided to change things up a bit and started a new career as a teacher. I thank God every day for the opportunity and challenge. The class teaches entrepreneurial skills through repurposing all kinds of prebuilt wood items, turning them into up-to-date creations, and then sell-

ing them! Many of our items are pieces of furniture or wood decor. The kids take home 70–80% of the final sales of the product. My classes had a record-breaking attendance rate this year! Next year they have increased my classes from 2 to 5 with 26 students in each class. It has been an honor to uplift and work with what many find difficult teens. God has given me a passion to love on them and fill their lives in all kinds of ways, even monetarily! This past school year the kids sold over \$10,000 in projects! The Lord has provided for us every step of the way and, in turn, has provided for these impoverished kiddos! The kids told me they bought groceries and clothes, ate at Chick-Fil-A for the first time, or even helped pay the bills at home.

## **Changes to Recycling Program**

Our single-stream recycling provider has started to levy a \$26 recycling contamination fine for every non-recyclable item in the dumpster at pickup. We've been charged multiple fines per month with fees well over \$200 for one pickup.

### IT'S NOT ALL NAILS AND PAINT!

Work campers going on our mission trip to Biloxi should keep in mind that this is a mission experience that goes beyond hammers and paint brushes!

Here are some ideas to provide a change of pace or to keep non-construction participants busy:

### MICAH DAY CENTER.

On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, volunteers assist staff with serving the needs of our homeless guests who come during the morning for showers, laundry, use of the telephone and computer, and to sign up for other services offered.

Volunteers help run the laundry equipment, clean the showers between each use, and monitor the supply room. In between tasks, you get a chance to chat with our guests, too!

### **FOOD PANTRY**



This small room in our Administration Building is where we stock food items which can be given to persons who stop in during the week for emergency assistance. Two volunteers can help us restock shelves, keep them in order, sort for expiration dates, and generally help with related tasks on Monday, Wednesday and Friday (9-11:30).

### LOAVES & FISHES

Back Bay Mission has a long history with the Loaves & Fishes Soup Kitchen. Volunteers are needed Monday thru Friday to assist with meal preparation, serving, and clean up. Volunteers must wear long pants and if the group includes anyone under the age of 18, must be accompanied by an adult.



AND, OF COURSE, all the skills and energy you can recruit for housing recovery jobs: painting, dry wall, carpentry, roofing, cabinetry work, flooring – and other tasks on your skill sheet.
